

Flames Ignite Clothing and Two Women Burned

Two women received painful burns, one narrowly escaping death, Thursday in separate accidents, when their clothing became ignited from heating apparatuses.

Mrs. Clementine Gibson, 58, 4831 Tchoupitoulas street, was badly burned about the upper portion of her body when her clothing caught fire from a charcoal blaze in a furnace, at 1:30 Thursday afternoon. A daughter, Miss Louise Gibson, extinguished the flames, receiving burns about the hands. Mrs. Gibson was removed to Charity Hospital.

The clothing of Lubert A. Johnson, a domestic employed in the home of Mrs. B. L. Rubin, 5129 Danneel street, caught fire when she stood too close to a gas heater and causing her to be painfully burned about the right side. Mrs. Rubin extinguished the flames with a carpet. The victim is 18 years old and lives at 3406 Robert street.
