Bakery Operator Taken by Death

Nicolò Evola, who owned and operated the United Bakery at 1325 St. Bernard ave., died Saturday at Hotel Dieu following a brief illness. He was 60.

Funeral services will be conducted Monday at 2 p. m. at the funeral home of Lamana-Panno-Fallo, Inc., 625 N. Rampart, followed by Masonic services at the Grand Consistory of Louisiana, 619 Carondelet.

Mr. Evola, who resided at the St. Bernard ave. address, was a native of Cinisi, Italy. He had resided in New Orleans for the past 45 years and was a member of the Dante Lodge No. 174, Free and Accepted Masons, the Grand Consistory, and the Jerusalem Temple Shrine.
