Police Thursday were looking for holdup men who robbed a restaurant and a bar of a total of **\$**210.

Officers said from the description given by witnesses in both holdups, the holdup men apparently were the same.

Robbed were:

Irwin's restaurant, 2505 Carondelet, about 11:40 p. m. Wednesday, \$110 and Ruffino's Bar, 626 St. Philip, about 12:20 a. m. Thursday, \$100.

An artist who was a patron at Irwin's saw the holdup without jealizing what was going on. He later drew a sketch of one of the höldup men for police.
